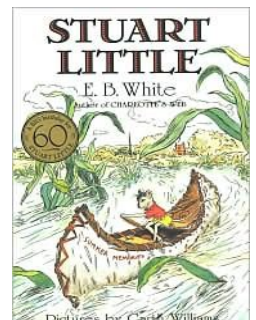

# Little CULVER CITY READS 2008 PROMISES TO BE BIG FUN!!

The Culver City Friends of the Library invite you to join us in *Little CULVER CITY READS*, the 2008 edition of our annual, community-wide reading celebration. Every summer, we choose a very special book and encourage people of all ages throughout Culver City to read it and participate in a series of events and activities. Sharing the same book broadens the appreciation of reading, stimulates discussions among friends and family, and promotes understanding of other people's viewpoints.

As the name shows, our program this year is more compact than in previous years, but every bit as exciting. This year we've chosen the much loved children's classic *Stuart Little* by E. B. White. The summer's Schedule of Events combines read-aloud story times, a chance for kids to meet and handle real mice, a demonstration of how the wizards at Sony Studios create their amazing effects, and *Stuart Little* himself coming to the Culver City Library to read aloud from his adventures. All of these celebrations build to our main event, an after-hours

pajama party in the library, with food, games, prizes and a special screening of the movie *Stuart Little* on Saturday, August 9. As in past years, these events will be featured in the Culver City News throughout the summer. 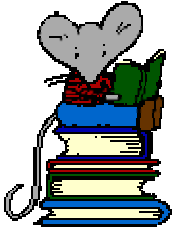

## SUMMER STORY-TELLING

Every Wednesday all summer long at 2:00 pm, you can enjoy the storytelling troupe We Tell Stories performing interactive story-based plays at the library. The plays are designed for schoolage children, but preschoolers are welcome to attend as well and they love the shows too! The theme for the County-wide Summer Reading Program this year is "Catch the Reading Bug," so many of the plays will be bug-related. Check the library for a flyer listing all the plays -- and look for an extra-special performance on August 20th in celebration of Fiesta La Ballona! No registration or reservation is required to attend. ## SUMMER READING GAMES

All children are encouraged to sign up for the reading-game portion of Summer Reading Program. Again, the theme is "Catch the Reading Bug" and the program includes children who read and children who are being read to. There will be two separate reading games: a reading game for the babies, toddlers, and preschoolers and another game for the schoolage children through starting grade 5 in the Fall. Participants will receive prizes (incentives) by participating in the reading game. The program is flexible and participants do not have to attend at any particular time in order to participate or collect their prizes; they may sign up any time during any hours the library is open. The grand prize is a bicycle donated by the Culver Westside Dental Group. There will only be one grand prize awarded and only those who have completed at least one reading game will be eligible.

## SUMMER STORY TIMES

**Under 3:** The summer session of My First Storytime for children under three years of age will be from 7/2 - 8/27 on Mondays and Wednesdays @ 10 am. Pre-registration is required and has already begun. Classes are limited to 25 children.

**Ages 3-5:** The summer session of Preschool Storytime for children 3-5 years of age will be on Wednesdays at 11 a.m. from 7/2 - 8/27. Pre-registration is required and has already begun. Class size is limited to 45 children.

**Entering K – 8 yrs:** Bedtime Storytime will continue all summer-long, Tuesdays @ 7 p.m. for school-age children to 8 years old. Preschoolers, toddlers and babies are also welcome. There is no registration required.



**Teens:** The 'Metamorphosis Teen Summer Reading Program' for readers in Grades 6-12, will run from July to August. Teen Readers: you can read to earn fun rewards!. By reading and turning in bookmarks, earn small to big prizes...the more you read, the bigger the prize! Teens can also join us this summer for Knitting Mondays, and Teen Tuesdays for Videogames, Boardgames, Creative Arts/ Food projects, Project Morph T-Shirt Design, Bookclub and Movie Days.
