Based on input from the community, the book selected was "**Peter Pan**," the timeless story of adventure and magic by J.M. Barrie. We held a series of exciting events and activities revolving around the book which culminated in an "Under the Stars" screening of the movie at Veterans Park. I'm thrilled so many of you could participate.

The *Culver City Reads* program brought together community members, businesses and organizations all working together with a common goal – to promote reading, education and literacy in our community. We had several additional goals as well. These included increasing awareness of the Friends, getting more people involved, and raising necessary funds for our Library. I'm very pleased to report that we accomplished all our goals and raised over \$25,000! BRICC to Start Again

The Friends is pleased to announce that BRICC (Building Readers In Culver City) will start up again in January, 2007. BRICC is a children's literacy program aimed at motivating children to read. The first session of BRICC ran from April to July of 2006 and was a huge success! (See page 7 for details of the Ice Cream Party Celebration and Awards Ceremony held in July).

BRICC rewards children for every age-appropriate book they read, by placing a "BRICC" featuring their name on the wall of the Library. Acquiring ten "BRICCs" signals the building of an entire house. Prizes are awarded for each BRICC earned. Grand prizes are also awarded at the end of the contest to each child who completes a house.

The entire program is free due to the generous sponsorship of Laing Urban, a division of John Laing Homes, whose headquarters are located in Culver City.

Coloring and Essay Contest Winners

The Friends sponsored two contests associated with the 2006 Culver City Reads Program: a Peter Pan Coloring

Contest and an Essay Contest. For the coloring contest, children through third grade were invited to color a picture portraying Peter Pan characters. For the essay contest, participants were invited, in 300 words or less, to tell us "Why I Want to Grow Up in Culver City."

The coloring contest winners were Grace Freedson and Kyle Van Slyke and the essay contest winners were Jennifer Talreja and Ruth Lampert Marolda. Congratulations to the winners!

On Sunday, August 27 at Fiesta La Ballona, the Scarlet Sisters (mermaid and pirate acrobats) and Captain Hook (aka Alan Corlin) led contest participants to the Community Stage. Captain Hook presented certificates and prizes to the essay contest winners, Jennifer Talreja and Ruth Lampert Marolda, who read their essays to the audience. Grace Freedson, Peter Pan coloring contest winner, and other



coloring contest participants were called up to the stage to receive their certificates and prizes. The audience was treated to an outdoor story time with Captain Hook who read Peter Pan. We thank everyone who participated in the contests; all entries were fantastic. The contest was judged by the Friends' Executive Board. Entries were anonymous at the time of judging.

A Treasure Chest of Recipes

The Culver City Friends of the Library has prepared a taste-tempting **COOKBOOK** featuring 250 favorite recipes from members of our community. The cookbook is beautifully illustrated, easy-to-read, professionally printed and bound, and sure to be treasured for years.

2006 Culver City Reads:

Peter Pan

Culver City Reads is an annual community-wide reading fest sponsored by the Culver City Friends of the Library to promote reading, education, and literacy. This program encourages people of all ages to read the same book. After loads of input from our community, the book selected for 2006 was "**Peter Pan**" by J. M. Barrie. Throughout the summer months, the Friends held a series of very successful events and activities revolving around this book showing how books come alive and raising more than \$25,000 for the Library.

Peter Pan, pixies and pirates visited Veterans Park!

On Saturday, **August 19**, the Friends brought Peter Pan, pixies and pirates – and true community and family fun – to Veterans Park when more than 500 people turned out for an "Under the Stars" screening of Universal's family film "Peter Pan." Highlights of this event included: Peter Pan characters, fresh popcorn made and distributed by Culver City firefighters, a costume parade, games, souvenirs, food, live entertainment, a drawing for great prizes and "fun packs" with all kinds of goodies to help the audience play along with the movie. More than **100 volunteers**



helped put on this event -- too many to list in this newsletter! REMEMBERING OUR FRIENDS!

Chuck Baird



On Monday September 4th, off-duty Culver City Firefighter and Paramedic, Chuck Baird (far right) suffered fatal injuries when his motorcycle crashed in Culver City. Chuck was an active member of the Fire Department for 12 years and an active supporter of the Friends of the Library. Memorial services were held on Tuesday, September 12, at Veteran's Memorial Auditorium, followed by a funeral procession to Holy Cross Cemetery in Culver City. In his comments at the memorial service, Chief Eastman noted that just a few weeks ago, he was serving popcorn with Chuck at the Friends of the Library movie event at Veterans Park.
