Interview with Kelly Conn

Community Library Manager

When did you start working at our branch of the library and where you were previously?

The first day the library closed for the COVID-19 pandemic was also my first day as the manager of Culver City Julian Dixon Library. Prior to my arrival, I had worked at LA County Library locations in West Hollywood, Hermosa Beach, Avalon on Catalina Island, Lennox, and View Park.

What do you see as the main role of this library in the community? I see the main role of the library as a hub for connection, learning, and enrichment for all ages. It's a place where the community should feel safe and cared for. The library is a resource for people to handle practical matters, explore their interests, feed their curiosity, and maybe even pursue their dreams.

What are some services or programs that people might not realize the library offers?

The library of course provides access to books, magazines, newspapers, movies and music—but it also offers some lesser-known services like ten free pages of daily printing/copying, a high school diploma program, California State Parks parking passes, online learning courses, passes to museums and other cultural institutions, annual tax forms, online homework help with live tutors, and a variety of in-person programs. Staff also take special pride in creating a responsive collection within Culver City Julian Dixon Library's four walls.
